DID YOU KNOW...

- In 2019, 5,244 individuals in Erie County experienced homelessness.

- 26% of Erie County residents live above the poverty line, but still cannot afford all their basic household expenses.
- · Hunger remains a critical problem in Erie County—1 in 8 people do not have consistent access to enough food.

SANDWICH PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS







GENERAL GUIDELINES

- · We suggest an estimate of 1 oz of peanut butter and 1 oz of jelly per sandwich. This equals 16 sandwiches for every pound of peanut butter and jelly.
- Consider buying the supplies in large jars or bulk size containers.
- Please have your teams wear plastic gloves when making the sandwiches.
- · You will need Ziploc bags for the sandwiches and large boxes to put them in. Pack the sandwiches vertically in the box to prevent them from getting crushed and soggy.
- The approximate cost of supplies for making 300 sandwiches is \$100. (Ten people can prepare 300 sandwiches in about one hour.)
