

YOU HELP PEOPLE BUILD SKILLS TO ACHIEVE LONG-TERM STABILITY.


Thanks to your support:

WE DO OUR RESEARCH.



We invest in the areas of most need in our community.

We conduct research and report our findings through the community report card series. Current topics include financial hardship, which introduces ALICE (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed). ALICE is defined as households in Erie County that earn income above the federal poverty level, but still cannot afford a household survival budget.

WE FUND PROGRAMS THAT CREATE CHANGE.

We find every dollar we can to address these problems. The United Way annually invests **\$1.4 million** into financial stability initiatives in Buffalo and Erie County.

- 7,551 individuals and families received free tax preparation services.
- 1,343 community members completed a training program to improve their likelihood of obtaining and maintaining employment.
- 7,318 individuals were provided with financial education and asset-building services.
