Important dates

- Applications are due by Friday, October 29 at 4pm
- Preliminary funding decisions announced: March 2022
- Funding starts: July 1, 2022



Notable changes from last cycle

- Seven focus areas: early learning and development; school-age learning; employment and workforce development; financial capability and asset building; healthy birth outcomes; childhood obesity; trauma-informed care
- All focus areas are open for applications
- Increased focus on acknowledging and addressing systemic inequities
- 5,000 character limit on narrative questions you are *not* expected to use the full space every time
- Scoring rubric is included in the application no back and forth with reviewers

Q: How do I know if my program is eligible to apply? And, how do I know if my program is a good fit for UWBEC funding?

A: Eligibility criteria can be found on page 3 of the RFP.

Fit is a bit trickier to determine. Look closely at the **goal**, **strategies**, and **outcome measures** for each focus area - the strongest fit is if you know your program compellingly and comprehensively speaks to each of those criteria.

Q: How many strategies should I choose in my application? Is it better if I include more than one?

A: Use the scoring rubric as a guide as you craft your application. It's exactly the same rubric as what the reviewers will use when they are scoring.

But, like before, focus on telling the most compelling and comprehensive story you can. More is not necessarily better.



Q: Does the program or the organization need to be operational since September 1, 2019?

A: The **program** needs to be operational since September 1, 2019.



Q: Will UWBEC fund more than one program per organization within the same focus area?

A: Yes! We are willing to fund multiple programs from one organization within a focus area.



Q: Can an organization submit more than one application for funding?

A: Yes! We accept multiple applications per organization. However, we **do not** accept more than one application **per program**.



Q: My program serves multiple focus areas. Should I combine them all into one application or submit separate applications?

A: Because we do not accept more than one application per program, you will want to apply in the one focus area where you feel your program is the strongest. While you need to choose strategies and outcome measures in that one focus area, you are welcome to reference your work in the other areas in your application.



Q: Can you reference multiple programs in one application?

A: While it's okay to mention other programs within your organization, you will want to focus your application largely on the single program for which you're applying.



Q: Does the \$30,000 minimum request apply to one year of funding or the entire two-year funding cycle?

A: The minimum funding request is with respect to one year of funding. When you answer Q18 (total amount requested) please tell us the amount you are requesting for one year.



Q: Every narrative question says 5,000 characters. Am I expected to use all of them?

A: No, we don't expect you to use the whole space for every question. We standardized the amount of space available to make it easier for you as you're building your answers. Please only use as much space as your answer needs; **longer answers are not always better answers**.



Q: Question 29 asks about partnering with UWBEC grants or initiatives. What does that mean?

A: We mean specific programmatic initiatives that are spearheaded by UWBEC, such as Breastfeeding Friendly Continuum, CATCH (Coordinated Approach to Child Health), Doula Task Force, Emergency Food and Shelter Program, Full Service Community Schools, Girls in Sports, GO Buffalo Mom, IMPLICIT Interconception Care, Siemer Family Stability Program, United Way Works, and VITA sites.

This **does not include** work with our funded partner agencies or partnering on UWBEC volunteer engagement opportunities such as Day of Caring or Business Meets Community.



Q: Looking at questions 38 through 42, should we answer about our program or our organization?

A: Questions 38, 39, and 40 should be answered about the program for which you're applying. In contrast, questions 41 and 42 are about your organization itself.
