Our nation's tax season will start on Monday, January 29, 2024 to begin accepting and processing 2023 tax year returns. You may qualify for one of the following options offered by the WNY Regional VITA Network partner organizations. If you earned \$64,000 or less in adjusted gross income, you can get your federal and state taxes e-filed for free*, and you may qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

*IRS e-file is fast, more accurate, secure and simple. While most returns can be processed, some may be more complex and need referral to a more specialized preparer.

FILE YOUR TAXES ONE OF TWO WAYS:

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (VITA) SITES

Free, supported tax preparation services for anyone who earns less than \$64,000. Volunteer tax preparers are fully trained and IRS certified to complete and e-file your return at no charge. MyFreeTaxes® is a service offered by United Way for free tax preparation for people at all income levels who have a simple return. You can file your taxes completely online from the comfort of your home. Visit **myfreetaxes.com** to get started.

IRS FREE FILE

IRS Free File Guided Tax Software, available only at IRS.gov, is available to any taxpayer or family with Adjusted Gross Income of \$79,000 or less in 2023. Visit **irs.gov** to get started.

AARP TAX-AIDE

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide provides in-person and virtual tax assistance to anyone, free of charge, with a focus on taxpayers who are over 50 and have low to moderate income. Tax-Aide volunteers are located nationwide, and are trained and IRS-certified every year to make sure they know about and understand the latest changes and additions to the tax code. MILTAX

MilTax generally offers free return preparation and electronic filing software for federal income tax returns and up to three state income tax returns for all military members, and some veterans, with no income limit. Visit militaryonesource.mil to get started.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME?

SOCIAL SECURITY CARDS

Social security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification notices/cards for you, your spouse and/or dependents



IDENTIFICATION

- Picture ID, such as a valid driver's license or other government issued ID, for you and your spouse, if applicable
- If you are married filing jointly, both spouses must be present
- · An Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) assignment letter may be substituted for you, your spouse and your dependents if you do not have a Social Security number



- Wage and earning statements (Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, 1099-MISC) from all jobs held during the tax year
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)

HEALTH INSURANCE STATEMENTS

- Affordable Health Care Statements 1095-A, B or C
- Health Insurance Exemption Certificate, if received (Form 8965)



EDUCATION CREDITS & ADJUSTMENTS

If you, your spouse or a child attended college—tuition expense statement (1098-T) and/or student loan interest



CHILD CREDITS

- Total paid for child care/day care expenses: provider name, address, tax ID# (SS# or business EIN)
- · Documentation of court-ordered child support



ITEMIZED DEDUCTIONS

- · Medical bills paid
- Charitable contributions made during the year
- Itemized business expenses



PROPERTY TAXES

- · Home interest and property taxes paid
- · Rental information for NYS credit



ADDITIONAL ITEMS

- · Birth dates of you, your spouse and/or dependents on return
- Proof of account routing and account numbers for direct deposit such as a blank check
- · A copy of last year's tax return
